


# **PUPIL SHEET**

### • Form a group of about 6 pupils. Try to answer these questions as a group:

Question	Answer	
Why do you get vaccinated?		
Name any vaccines you have heard of.		
What does it mean if someone says they have immunity against a disease?		
Have you heard about a new vaccine which can protect you from getting certain kinds of cancer?		
If so, what is the cancer which it is protecting you from?		

## • Now you can use some of the help cards to find out more about: IMMUNITY, VACCINATION and CERVICAL CANCER.

Once you have read and discussed the help cards explain something about each of the pictures below:



Now, still as a group, read out the following dialogue.
First you must decide who is going to play part A, B, C and D.
