Programme Overview

1. Introduction



2. About the programme

The programme is open to all young people in Scotland to inspire, lead and mentor their peers through the creation and delivery of STEM activities, events and interactions within schools, communities and youth groups. YSLP is available across six levels split into two versions:



- The non-formal version of YSLP is offered at Curriculum for Excellence Second, Third and Fourth Levels (YSL2, YSL3 and YSL4 (NF)). Typically delivered in primary schools, the BGE phase of secondary schools and in youth and community settings, these awards are made up of four digital badges: Discover, Create, Inspire and Lead. Completing the four digital badges satisfies the requirements of the award at these levels.
- The formal version of YSLP is offered at SCQF Levels 4, 5 and 6 (YSL4 (F), YSL5 and YSL6). Typically delivered in the senior phase of secondary schools, youth and community groups and some further education/apprenticeship programmes, the formal awards consist of eight learning outcomes (LOs) with associated performance criteria and minimum action required. These awards are SCQF credit rated and levelled by SQA.



3. Staffing and Governance

The Scottish Government-funded YSLP is led by SSERC in partnership with the following organisations who formed part of the original YSLP Steering Group. These organisations support the delivery and implementation of YSLP across Scotland.


































3. Staffing and Governance (continued)

The YSLP team based at SSERC work with partner organisations to coordinate the programme at a national level, including overseeing the training and quality assurance procedures, developing award content and coordinating regional appointees.

The team of 15 Associate Regional Trainers and Verifiers (ARTAVs) support quality assurance and training at a regional level. The team is made up of teachers and community workers who already have an existing Tutor Assessor role within their centre, but act as consultants for SSERC to support YSLP deliverables.

The remit of the ARTAV team includes:

- External verification
- Delivering YSLP professional learning
- Supporting YSLP activity within their local area
- Developing YSLP resources
- Supporting other SSERC programmes, including STEM Ambassadors in Scotland and Education Industry Partnerships

SSERC adopts a Regional Improvement Collaborative model in terms of how we allocate ARTAVs to areas of Scotland. Each of the ARTAVs makes a valuable contribution to the success of the award through their expertise, insights and knowledge.



4. Participation


Participation in YSLP Programmes this academic year continued to grow, with an estimated 10,000 YSLs engaging with the programme across each of Scotland's 32 Local Authority Areas.





We were pleased to see many YSLs completing an award, despite challenges faced with a move back to exam qualifications.


Awards issued during academic year 2021/2022

Deliverables in Academic Year 2021/2022

5. Training and Professional Learning





Professional learning sessions delivered included:

- Information Sessions
- Tutor Assessor Training a two-hour session covering an overview of award frameworks, assessment and quality assurance
- Tutor Assessor Connections monthly networking and spotlight sessions for Tutor Assessors
- Kickstart Sessions refresher training for Tutor Assessors
- · Webinars covering quality assurance and assessment
- Ongoing support, networking and conference presentations

Over 1300 attendances were made at YSLP events during this session. This includes open access sessions delivered online by the YSLP team as well as bespoke training for specific organisations including Local Authorities, schools and youth work settings. Bespoke Tutor Assessor training has also been delivered to cohorts, schools, clusters, organisations and local authorities across Scotland, this will continue into next session and beyond.





6. #YoungSTEMLeaderWeek

Following a successful launch in 2020, #YoungSTEMLeaderWeek returned in October 2021. The week is used as an opportunity to launch the programme in participating centres, for Young STEM Leaders to lead activities around a particular theme, or for new leaders to engage in some exciting online experiences. For the first time, an online Tutor Assessor Conference was held with over 100 delegates taking part.

Each day was set around a specific theme linked to the programme, with a mix of activities available:

- Activities for Tutor Assessors to deliver to YSLs, and for YSLs to lead to their audiences.
- Challenges that YSLs could take part in and share on social media using the hashtag #YoungSTEMLeaderWeek
- Live events to inspire and engage YSLs, led by our partner organisations such as Dynamic Earth, Education Scotland, STEM Ambassadors in Scotland and Leidos. Over 1000 young people took part in these online events.
- Professional learning for Tutor Assessors, including our first ever Tutor Assessor Conference attended by over 100 delegates.

<u>Young STEM Leader Week</u> will take place again from 31 October – 4 November 2022 with the theme **Future of STEM**.

7. Auto-awards

The YSLP team have been engaging with various STEM award providers to align YSLP to existing awards and frameworks. This provides the opportunity for young people completing other programmes to gain additional recognition through a Young STEM Leader award. This session, around 20% of YSLP awards were achieved through an auto-award route.

9. Development activity in 2021/2022



In addition to what has been mentioned above, a number of other developments took place within the YSLP this year, including

- New components of the YSLP online platform were launched, including:
 - Automated internal verification
 - Automated certification
 - Ongoing adjustments to improve the user journey through the website
- A new STEM Programmes Coordinator and three new ARTAVs joined the team.
- A grant fund from the Institute of Physics was launched to support YSLs in delivering physics-based activities in their centres.
- YSLP was showcased at a number of conferences and events, including the Digital Youth Work conference, the Scottish Learning Festival, the STEM Teaching and Inspiration Awards for Scotland and the Fife STEM Connectability festival.
- The YSLP team welcomed its first college centre to the programme, Dundee & Angus College.
- The YSL5 and YSL4 awards were delivered through the DYW Live strand of the eSgoil online learning platform.
- In partnership with SLQ, the new STEM Leaders Qualification was launched in England, based on the existing Young STEM Leader frameworks.
- New e-Modules were developed in partnership with Education Scotland's Improving Gender Balance and Equalities team and Dynamic Earth.
- Development of YSLP Masterclasses, a set of resources for the formal levels to support the front-loaded teaching section of the YSL4, YSL5 or YSL6 award to be delivered as a one day event.
- Development of Standards Guidance resources, a set of documents containing example evidence and commentary from Young STEM Leader Logs at all levels.

3 Professional learning delivery	 We will deliver targeted training programmes to undersubscribed local authorities as identified by the YSLP Project Team and team of ARTAVs. YSLP/ARTAV team will continue to provide a high-quality professional learning offer for new and existing Tutor Assessors, including: Information Sessions, Tutor Assessor Training, TA Connections, Webinars, Kickstart Sessions.

The quality assurance processes of the YSLP allows SSERC to maintain the integrity, standards and values of the award.

11. YSLP Beyond Scotland

Scottish Government and SSERC Board approval allowed for a new joint venture between SSERC and Sports Leaders Qualification (SLQ) to develop and launch a new STEM Leader award for schools in England.

Two levels of a new Qualification in STEM Leadership have been developed:

- Level 1 Qualification in STEM Leadership (Key Stage 3/Years 7 and 8), broadly equivalent to SSERC's YSL4 award.
- Level 2 Qualification in STEM Leadership (Key Stage 4/Years 9 and 10, broadly equivalent to SSERC's YSL5 award.

In November 2021, SLQ launched the STEM Leaders programme into the English secondary education market via a joint venture with SSERC. Developed in partnership with SSERC, STEM Leaders encourages learners to inspire, lead and mentor their peers through the creation and delivery of STEM activities events and interactions within their schools, communities or youth groups.

During this pilot year, Pioneer STEM centres have helped support and shape the development of the programme, providing valuable feedback and sharing good practice with potential new STEM centres. Over 300 learners have engaged in the programme and will continue to develop their leadership skills within their setting.
